

## CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS

### JAMES COOK UNIVERSITY LAW REVIEW 2008

The *James Cook University Law Review* is a peer-reviewed journal that aims to encourage critical, conceptual and contextual analysis of legal interests. It values articles on any legal topic including articles that incorporate a discussion of regional topics in a national and international context.

The JCULR Editorial Board is currently inviting submission of original articles, case notes, book reviews and comments to the *James Cook University Law Review* (Vol 15, 2008). Only previously unpublished material that has not been submitted for consideration by another journal will be accepted. **The deadline for submission is 15 August 2008** with an anticipated date of publication in late 2008.

Submissions should follow the [Advice for Contributors](#) guidelines. In brief:

- Articles should be between 5000 and 8000 words.
- Book reviews and review essays should be between 2000 and 5000 words.
- Case notes should be no longer than 3000 words.
- Style should follow the Melbourne University Law Review Association Inc's *Australian Guide to Legal Citation* (2<sup>nd</sup> ed, 2002). The Guide is available online at <http://mulr.law.unimelb.edu.au/aglc.asp>.

Contributors need to download and complete the [Contributor Information](#) document and submit with all article submissions to: [Law.Review@jcu.edu.au](mailto:Law.Review@jcu.edu.au). All papers published in the journal will be reviewed by at least two anonymous referees.

Note - The Editorial Board welcomes high quality submissions by students and young lawyers. Student assignment or thesis material may require extensive work in order to reach a suitable standard for publication. Undergraduate students are therefore strongly advised to consult with a member of academic staff to ensure their submission is likely to be of a standard to meet the publication requirements of the journal.
