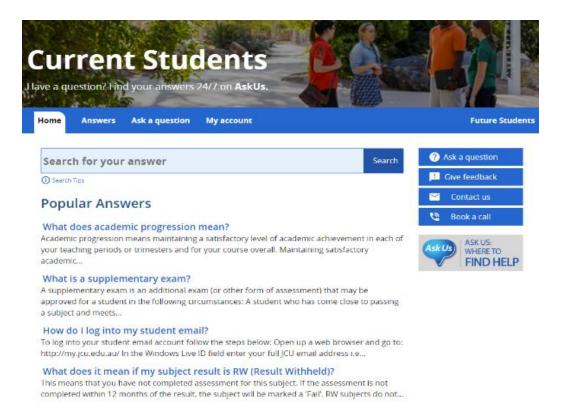

Fees and Scholarships



Domestic Tuition Fees

Domestic students pay the Student Contribution amount, and the Government covers the rest of the tuition cost.

Who are domestic students?

- Australian citizens
- New Zealand citizens
- Australian permanent residents





Payment of Student Contribution Amount

Australian citizens and holders of a permanent humanitarian visa:

 can defer payment through the HECS-HELP scheme if the student has provided their <u>Tax File</u> <u>Number</u>.

New Zealand citizens and holders of a permanent non-humanitarian visa:

must pay tuition fees upfront

Please Note:

- Fee statements are NOT mailed out
- It is every student's responsibility to be aware of fees and payment due dates
- Students can access their own fee statement (tax invoice) showing outstanding fees through eStudent



Student Services and Amenities Fee

The Student Services and Amenities Fee (SSA Fee) was introduced by the Australian Government to improve university support services and facilities for students both on and off campus.

The SSA Fee is charged on the basis of study load. There is a charge per subject and a maximum charged per calendar year.

The income from the fee is used to provide a range of student support services and facilities that students can access, including:

- Providing food and drinks to students on campus
- Student Advocacy Officer
- Legal services to students
- Orientation activities
- Libraries and study spaces
- Sports and recreation activities
- Careers and employment advice
- Health and wellbeing services

Tips for JCU Families

Encourage discussions -

Encourage your student to engage and ask questions. Whether it's asking us, their Lecturer, Course Coordinator or the Librarian, we are all here to help your student succeed. Don't rely on hearsay and always fact check advice from other students.

Promote participation -

Encourage your student to attend O Week and use the resources we have available for them throughout the semester. Use the Learning Centre online resources, attend workshops and access Studiosity, a free online learning advice service available to all students. There are also counselling, career planning and Peer Assisted Study Sessions (PASS) available.

Plan for success -

Support your student by being across the Academic Calendars. Knowing when exams and important dates are coming up like Census Date is key, in case they need to lighten their study load. Remember, holidays and travel are not legitimate reasons for missing or deferring an exam.

How to support your family member





The JCU Experience

Diversity of student population at JCU:

- 50% of students are school leavers
- 50% of students are mature age
- 47.6% are first in family students
- 20.3% have low socio-economic status
- 15% have a first language other than English
- 6.5% have a disability





University Culture

Transition from work/school to university:

- Students are treated as adults
- Self-goal setting is critical

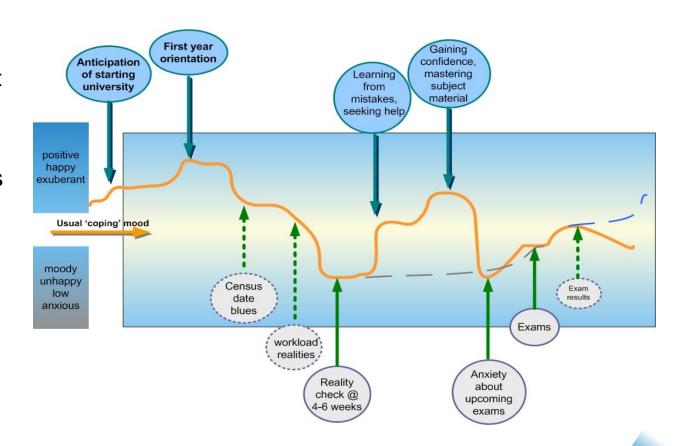
Independent Learning model:

- No one will check work completion
- Aim to allocate 10-12 hours per subject every week
 - ✓ 3 hours prep reading
 - √ 3 hours post revision
 - ✓ 2-3 hours assessment preparation



First Study Period Experience

- Students commonly encounter natural emotional peaks and troughs across the first study period
- Expect these and prepare to provide encouragement and support at difficult times
- Remind them of their original purpose in enrolling
- Remind them their goals haven't changed
- Encourage them to stick at it
- Celebrate their wins
- If they are in distress, ask them to make an appointment with a Learning Advisor or Counsellor





How can you support your student?

- Starting uni is both daunting and exciting
- Provide an empathetic ear
- Be the non-judgmental support they need
- Demonstrate interest in what they are learning
- Ask questions about the topics covered, what happened in classes that day, and what their assignments are about
- Provide a dedicated study zone (or encourage them to use the library)
- Research shows the more engaged they are, the higher their satisfaction levels, and therefore resilience

- Encourage involvement (key to learning)
 - ✓ Encourage them to ask questions
 - ✓ Remind them that if they don't understand something, the chances are that others probably don't either
 - ✓ Encourage them to use support services

- Appointment based system with face-to-face and telehealth (phone or zoom)





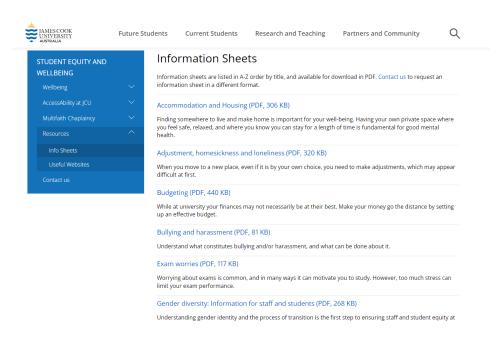

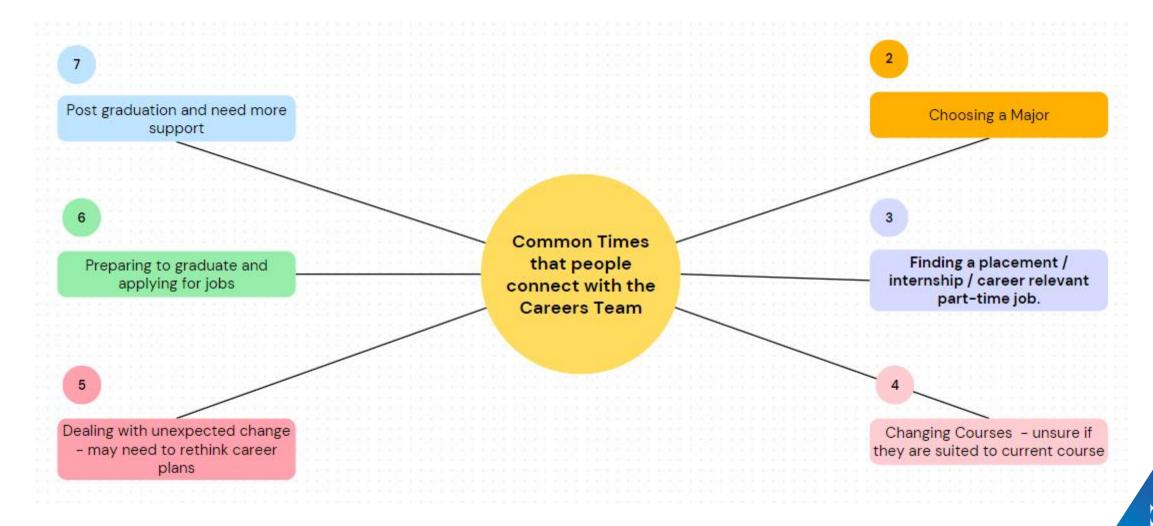

What is AccessAbility Services?

We are a free and confidential support service for all registered JCU students who identify as having a short or long term disability, injury, illness or health condition.

Students who are neurodivergent or who have a mental health condition may benefit from support.

We provide **information and practical advice about the support available at JCU** and ensure access to appropriate, reasonable adjustments and services.

Students are required to **provide documentation** about their disability or health condition from their health professional.

Access assistive equipment, technology and software, adjusted exam conditions, mobility aids, adjustments for placement and assessment.

JCU is committed to ensuring that students living with a disability and/or health condition have equal opportunities to access, engage and participate in all levels of our university. If you have a documented disability or a short or long term health condition, register with AccessAbility to access a range of support services and assistance to support you to succeed at JCU.

We understand that you may not identify your condition as a 'disability'. However, if your health condition is impacting in any way on your studies, even if temporarily, we are here to help.





Process

An Access Plan outlines the reasonable adjustments that support your participation at university.

Information about your disability or health condition is not shared unless you provide consent.

Register with AccessAbility

Meet with an Advisor and provide documentation Develop Reasonable Adjustments and Access Plan Access Plan sent to Subject Coordinators, Course Coordinator and Examinations

Review your plan each semester

- Ground floor of the Eddie Koiki Library in Townsville.
- Closest to the doors leading to the carpark.





Cairns Office

- First floor of the Library in Cairns.
- Near the top of the staircase.
- There is a lift available.
- Co-located with Counselling and Careers.





Student Success Officers

- Attached to undergraduate and postgraduate courses
- Supporting study progress during the study period.
 - Assessing personal challenges and developing a plan with the student to overcome them.
 - Providing referrals to appropriate specialist services at JCU and in the community.
 - Helping with JCU policies and administrative tasks relevant to study or assessment.
