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## Scholarly Writing Masterclass

One of the most satisfying experiences on the PhD journey is getting your work published. Yet writing for publication requires different skills and approaches to the thesis. Professor Richard Nile is one of Australia's most experienced scholarly editors. He has mentored and produced the work of hundreds of Higher Degree Research Students here and overseas. In this inaugural JCU series, Richard will introduce you to strategies for balancing progress on your thesis while dealing with the demands of becoming a published researcher. *Scholarly Writing for Publication* is a seven three-hour module masterclass convened across twelve weeks. You will learn new skills on how to negotiate the complex world of scholarly publishing, structure your research, manage your time and, importantly, write for publication. To qualify, you will need to have a draft manuscript and be prepared to work on it across the twelve week period. At the conclusion of the program, you will be expected to have produced a publishable piece of work ready for submission to a journal of other media platform. Classes are scheduled on alternate weeks throughout semesters 1 and 2 at both the Townsville and Cairns campuses. Numbers are strictly limited.

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## **Animals in Motion symposium, JCU Townsville campus, 16-17 February 2017**

You are invited to a collaborative symposium and workshop at JCU in Townsville, supported jointly by TropWATER, CTBCC, TESS and CSTFA.

The event aims to share technical knowledge and fresh insights on ways to enhance collaboration and conservation outcomes in studying animal movement ecology, including species on the ground, in the air and in the water.

Dates: **16 and 17 February 2017, 8.30 am to 4.30 pm**

Venue: **JCU Townsville campus** (room details t.b.a.) with lunch and morning/afternoon refreshments provided.

Program overview:

Thursday 16 Feb morning session – watch, listen and get inspired! Presenters will cover a broad range of innovative animal movement studies, highlighting their major research objectives, important outcomes and the many challenges of selecting effective technology and efficient analysis methods.

Thursday 16 Feb afternoon session: Hands-on analysis of movement data using R. This intermediate level workshop led by Dr Ross Dwyer will cover manipulation, plotting and statistical analysis of animal movement datasets, how to conduct standard GIS operations in R, visualise the results and produce publication-ready figures. Content will be tailored to participants' requirements as far as possible – in your RSVP please advise your own special interests and type of telemetry data etc. Basic knowledge of R is a pre-requisite for this workshop. See below about Intro to R training available on 13 Feb.

Friday 17 Feb morning session: a speed-talk-smorgasbord of tracking methods and analysis approaches, followed by Q and A forum. Bring your own questions! This is an opportunity to seek input from a range of experienced practitioners about specific challenges in your current/future animal movement projects.

Friday 17 Feb afternoon session: Short presentation followed by Panel Discussion exploring ways to enhance collaboration in animal movement studies. How can we find collaborative opportunities... understand different perspectives of diverse stakeholders... enhance research scope and funding prospects... enhance our own contributions to collaborative work? Our presenters will share a wealth of experience in diverse roles. Everyone in the audience is invited to join in with suggestions, questions and ideas for new collaborations.

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## National Survey: Using Social Media in Research

I am writing to invite researchers within your University to participate in a research project being conducted by La Trobe University: ***Recruiting, retaining and tracing participants via social media: Exploring the ethical concerns of ethics committee members and researchers to inform the development of guidelines.***

Increasingly researchers are using social media to recruit, retain and trace participants, yet there are few formal guidelines to assist with ethical decision making about social media. In this project, we are asking researchers for their views and ethical concerns about using social media in research. We will use the findings to develop ethical guidelines for using social media in research.

Participation in the study involves completing a 20 minute anonymous online survey. Neither the researchers nor your organisation will be identified in the survey.

We are inviting all active Australian researchers to participate. **We would appreciate it if you could forward this invitation to all academic researchers (including both academic staff and Masters by research and PhD students) at James Cook University.** We would like researchers to participate whether or not they have experience using social media in research.
