This will be a member of staff</p> <p>2 A person attending a facility on a permanent or temporary basis, such as an employee, contractor, student or resident.</p> <p>3 Person acting to manage JCU response to a Critical Incident</p> <p>4 A work related injury which resulted in a complete shift or more being lost from work as a result of an injury or illness.</p> <p>5 Any unplanned incident that occurred at the workplace which, although not resulting in an injury or disease, had the potential to do so.</p> <p>6 Personal Protective Equipment</p> <p>7 A matrix that is used as part of a risk assessment to define the various levels of risk as the likelihood of the harm occurring and the consequence of harm.</p> <p>9 Office of the Gene Technology Regulator. The regulator for dealings with GMO.</p> <p>11 JCU cloud based online electronic incident, injury, hazard and near miss reporting system.</p> <p>13 Substances where the physical, toxic, or chemical properties present an immediate hazard. The criteria to classify such substances are set out in the Australian Dangerous Goods Code.</p> <p>14 The person or entity with the accountability and authority to manage the risk.</p> <p>16 Any location for the purpose of work, study or research that is conducted by JCU staff, postgraduate and undergraduate students and volunteers at various sites which are on-campus, off- campus.</p> <p>17 A person diving as part of his / her work.</p> <p>19 Risk remaining after control measures have been implemented.</p> <p>20 An incident that arises internally, or from and external source, which may adversely affect the occupants or visitors, in a facility, and which requires an immediate response.</p> <p>21 Institutional Biosafety Committee</p> <p>23 The likelihood that harm will occur when exposed to a hazard and consequence of that harm (death, injury or illness).</p>
