2.	Words ending with -our	BE words ending with –our usually end with –or in AE:

3.	Words ending with  -ise or -ize	<ul> <li>BE verbs that can be spelled with either –ise or –ize at the end always end with –ize in AE:</li> </ul>	
		<u>British</u>	<u>American</u>
		apologize or apologise	apologize
		organize or organise	organize
		recognize or recognise	recognize
4.	Words ending with	BE verbs ending with –yse always end with –yze in AE:	
	-yse	<u>British</u>	<u>American</u>

5.	Words ending with ae or oe	BE words spelled with the double vowels αe or oe are spelled with e only in     AE:

6	Words ending with -ence	BE nouns ending with –ence sometimes end with –ense in AE:
