A Symphony of Stories

Join us at James Cook University for a special Book Week experience designed to bring stories and Years 9-11 high school students together from across our community. Inspired by this year's international book week theme – A Symphony of Stories – the day explores how narratives work in harmony: how certain character traits, situations and stories, set in motion, can become a wonderful ensemble.

This year's program features Australian author Joel Preston, a Detection Dog Handler by day and by night, writer of *The Old World Saga* – a dark fantasy series weaving together secret agents, mythology and cosmic terrors.

He studied at JCU before setting off to see the world, teaching English in Japan, trekking to Everest Base Camp, and climbing Mt Kilimanjaro. Those experiences of chasing horizons and testing limits now shape the worlds he builds on the page. Joel writes across genres and mediums, and is passionate about showing young creatives that a 'day job' and a creative life aren't mutually exclusive. They can fuel each other!

As well as an interactive workshop led by Joel Preston, high school students will experience a taste of university life.

Places are limited to ensure a high-quality, interactive experience and are expected to fill quickly. We encourage early registration to avoid missing out. Students and teachers are encouraged to come in costume, if permitted, but are not required to do so.

This year we celebrate our third Book Week @ JCU on the Townsville campus (Thursday August 27) and are also proud to offer our first program on the Cairns campus (Friday August 28).
