Information about the JCU Winter School for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Students

The JCU Winter School for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Students (Winter School) is a fully supervised, 5-day residential program coordinated by the Indigenous Education and Research Centre (IERC).

The program has been designed to provide Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students in Year 10, 11 and 12 with an opportunity to experience university life.

At the 2019 Winter School, up to 100 students will be introduced to tertiary studies in an area of their choice whilst also participating in university life with fellow Indigenous students from around Queensland. The program aims to assist students to identify their area of interest and clarify which subjects need to be chosen in high school to allow for further study in that field at university.

The Winter School combines the expertise of faculty, university and IERC Staff to provide a comprehensive and unique experience. It aims to develop students' confidence and familiarity with university studies through fun and engaging activities.

Who can apply

The Winter School is open to any Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Student who is in Year 10, 11 or 12 and is aspiring to complete a degree at James Cook University. You are encouraged to apply if you have previously attended this program.

Cost

The program runs at no cost to the student. All students are accommodated in residential colleges on the University campus and catering is provided for all participants while on campus.

Dates and location

The Winter School will run from Sunday 30th June- Friday 5th July, inclusive. All students will arrive the evening of Sunday 30th June 2019 and start the program on Monday 1 July 2019. The program is held at James Cook University's Douglas Campus in Townsville.

What does the program involve?

The Winter School will begin on Monday morning and run through to Friday afternoon. The program involves an extensive timetable including three full days with the University's College staff in the subject area selected by the student. Also included are academic skills sessions, cultural activities, excursions and night activities. All students attending the Winter School will be required to participate in all activities, including group presentations and team activities.

The days are fully scheduled; students are required to be up by 6:30am for breakfast and back in their room with lights out at 10:00pm each night. Students over the age of 18 must comply with the rules as set down for all other students who are not yet 18. Whilst the Indigenous Education and Research Centre acknowledges the legal age of students over 18, for the purposes of the program the same rules must apply to all participants. JCU staff will maintain a consistent duty of care to each individual student attending.

Who is required to complete the application?

As well as the applicant's information and declaration, the parent/guardian must also complete the declaration on page 8 and the student's school Principal must complete page 9 of the application. This is to ensure that the applicant's parent/guardian and school Principal are aware of and fully support the application.

How to apply

1. Discuss the application with your Teacher/Principal and parents first.
2. Print and complete the application form and sign the declaration pages 4-8.
3. Ensure your parent or guardian signs the declaration on page 9/10.
4. Return the document to your Principal and ask him/her to complete page 11.
5. Have a school staff member complete the school section on page 11.
6. You must include a copy of your 2018 end-of-year school report, including teacher comments.
7. Ask your school to return the completed application, preferably by email to the Indigenous Education and Research Centre by the closing date (contact details are on the last page of this document).

When to apply

Applications for the July 2019 program will open Monday 25th March 2019 and close 5pm Wednesday 15th May 2019.

Late or incomplete applications will not be accepted

When will you be notified of the outcome?

All students will be advised of the results of their application by 24th May 2019.

JCU Winter School for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Students Code of Conduct
