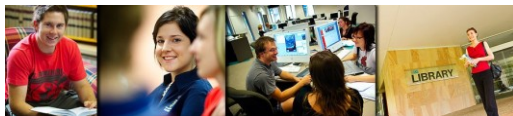

James Cook University was established to conduct teaching and research on areas of importance to North Queensland and the tropics world-wide. Our focus is on producing graduates who have the expertise and intellectual curiosity to make a difference in their profession and their communities and conducting the research needed to meet the challenges facing the tropical world. We are also committed to providing the professional workforce for under-served communities and providing access and opportunity to those people who may not have previously been able to access higher education.

At James Cook University our high quality research informs our teaching. Staff and students benefit from our tropical location to conduct nationally and internationally significant research in areas such as marine sciences, biodiversity, tropical ecology and environments, climate change, tourism, tropical medicine and public health. Our network of locations spans a wide geographic area and includes research stations on the Great Barrier Reef and in the world-heritage listed Daintree Rainforest. Our Research income has grown by over 13% between 2009 and 2010 and is projected to continue to grow strongly at our campuses in Australia and Singapore.

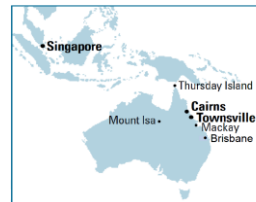
