PADDY PALLIN Science Grants 2016 - Supplementary round for marine research only

The Paddy Pallin Foundation, and The Foundation for National Parks & Wildlife are offering two Marine Science Grants in 2016, worth \$7000 each to support field-based, high quality marine ecological research. The objective of the Paddy Pallin Science grant program is to provide financial support for conservation-based research of Australian species and ecosystems that will ultimately lead to tangible outcomes for management. This is a fresh call for applications for marine research only and supplementary to the August 2016 round of grants. The scope of the research in this supplemental round is open to marine and freshwater research on animals and/or plants and ecological communities.

The grants are open to postgraduate students and Early Career Researchers (within 3 years of submitting PhD). Funding for 2016 will commence in December. The grant will be administered through the Royal Zoological Society of New South Wales.


