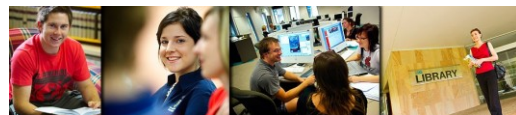

James Cook University was established to conduct teaching and research on areas of importance to the tropics. Our focus is on producing graduates who have the expertise to make a difference in their profession and their communities. We are also committed to providing the professional workforce for under-served communities and providing access and opportunity to those people who may not have previously been able to access higher education.

At James Cook University our high quality research informs our teaching. Staff and students benefit from our tropical location to conduct nationally and internationally significant research in areas such as marine sciences, biodiversity, tropical ecology and environments, climate change, tourism, tropical medicine and public health. Our network of locations spans a wide geographic area and includes research stations on the Great Barrier Reef and in the world-heritage listed Daintree Rainforest. Our Research income grew by over 13% between 2009 and 2010 and 15% between 2010 and 2011, and is projected to continue to grow strongly at our campuses in Australia and Singapore.
