Getting ready for university

As you start looking at subject choices, courses and universities, it is important to remember that you do not need to have your whole life figured out right now.

What is an ATAR?

ATAR is the Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank. The ATAR is not a score out of 100 – it is a rank. It shows a student's achievement in relation to other students.

The highest rank given is usually an ATAR of 99.95. This means they are ranked higher than 99.95% of students in that year. The reason it is not 100% is that the top ranking is usually shared amongst a number of students.

Why is the ATAR important?

JCU uses the ATAR to assess whether you can meet the academic requirements for your chosen university course.

It is important to understand, however, if you do not meet the ATAR requirements, there are often different study pathways that you can take to get to your desired course.

Not ATAR Eligible?

There are many pathways to entering university other than receiving an ATAR.

Some Certificate qualifications can give you guaranteed admission into a number of university courses. You can also study our entry pathways to then pursue a Bachelors course.

Provided Amy satisfactorily completes English (i.e. achieves a minimum Grade of C or better), she will be eligible for an ATAR because she has five General subjects studied at Units 3 and 4.


Pathway to uni entry, available after finishing Year 12

Early Offer Program




Secure your place at JCU while in Year 12.

Uni advancement

When you're in Year 12, you may be able to receive an early offer for a course prior to ATAR results being released. Talk to your school Guidance Officer/Careers Adviser about your intent to study at JCU and that you'd like to be considered for the Early Offer Program. They can assist you with completion of the Nomination Form to provide to your school for consideration.

Your school will then submit a recommendation based on your academic performance, motivation, talents, passion and capabilities to demonstrate your likelihood of success at university. You will also need to list JCU as your first preference when QTAC applications open.

Uni terms - what are we saying?

You've probably heard some uni jargon that doesn't mean much to you yet. Here's a quick guide to help you make sense of it all.

ATAR: The Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank, which provides a national comparative ranking of a student's academic performance in Year 12 relative to others graduating in the same year.

ASSUMED KNOWLEDGE: A minimum level of knowledge that you are assumed to have in a particular subject area prior to commencing.

BACHELOR DEGREE: An undergraduate academic qualification, typically requiring three to five years of full-time study or part-time equivalent.

CREDIT POINT: A basic measure of study load for each subject, with most subjects at JCU carrying a unit value of three credit points. A typical full-time study load for one academic year is 24 credit points (8 subjects), while part-time is generally no more than 75 percent of a full-time study load.

EARLY OFFERS: A program to help you secure a place to study at JCU before you finish Year 12, based on your school's recommendation and assessment of your academic performance, motivation and capabilities. You would still need to complete Year 12 and meet entry requirements for your chosen course of study.

GENERAL SUBJECT: An academic subject undertaken in secondary school, which can be counted towards an ATAR. Prerequisite subjects for a University course are often general subjects.

GUARANTEED ADMISSIONS PLAN:

Students with an ATAR of 90 and above are guaranteed entry into particular JCU courses with all subject prerequisites waived. Those with an ATAR of 73 and above are guaranteed entry to these courses if all subject prerequisites are met.

MAJOR: A primary area of specialisation within a Bachelor degree, including around eight related subjects in a particular discipline.

MINOR: A sub-specialisation in a Bachelor degree, including four related subjects in an area of study.

PREFERENCES: You can select up to six undergraduate degrees you'd most like to apply and be accepted for. First and second on your list would be the degrees you'd most like to study, followed by other options you're interested in as third and fourth. Your choices for five and six would be courses you are willing to study as a back-up and are confident you'll receive an offer for. You'll only be eligible for an Early Offer on JCU courses you nominate

as your first preference. You can add, delete, or change the order of your preferences online via your tertiary admission centre.

PREREQUISITE: A high school or university subject that you must complete before starting your degree or taking a higher-level university subject.


QTAC: The Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre (QTAC) operates a centralised tertiary application service. It assesses applications against entry requirements provided by JCU and then makes offers to successful applicants during offer rounds.

RECOMMENDED KNOWLEDGE: While not essential, prior study in these areas may assist you to understand more about the topics in a course of study.

SPECIAL ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: Some degrees require applicants to meet additional selection criteria or complete additional steps in the application process. This could be demonstrating prior study or industry experience, a supporting written application or a personal interview with JCU academic selectors.

UNDERGRADUATE: An academic program of study leading to a Diploma, Bachelor degree or Bachelor (Honours) degree.
