Social Work career pathways are varied. Depending on the field of practice chosen, Social Workers utilise skills and experience in management, education, research, policy development, politics and community planning.

Services, which Social Workers provide, include therapy, casework, advocacy, mediation, group work to individuals, couples or families to address issues such as mental health, sexual assault, family violence, loss and grief, illness, separation and substance addiction. Social Workers may contribute to policy development and advise governments on welfare issues.

- Develop policy and evaluate programs
