'Social Workers assess the social needs of individuals, families and groups, assist and empower people to develop and use the skills and resources needed to resolve social and other problems and further human wellbeing and human rights, social justice and social development'.

Social Work career pathways are varied. Depending on the field of practice chosen, Social Workers utilise skills and experience in management, education, research, policy development, politics and community planning.

Services which Social Workers provide, include therapy, casework, advocacy, mediation, group work to individuals, couples or families to address issues such as mental health, sexual assault, family violence, loss and grief, illness, separation and substance addiction. Social Workers may contribute to policy development and advise governments on welfare issues.

Social Workers may perform the following tasks:

- Counsel individuals through a crisis that may be due to death, illness, relationship breakdown or other reasons
- Provide clients with information about services that can assist them
- Help community groups plan and carry out programs to help themselves
- Research community problems, needs
- Develop policy and evaluate programs
