

The Graduate Certificate includes core subjects to develop students foundations in management of pharmaceutical services and pharmaceutical public health priorities. Students choose two electives to further their knowledge in a particular area of interest.

A range of elective subjects develop and enhance clinical skills and knowledge and allow students to specialise in areas such as a chronic disease management, health promotion, Indigenous health and international health research. Students also complete a pharmaceutical public health research project in an appropriate topic.
