PROFESSIONAL ACCREDITATION STATUS

Pending accreditation for the Accounting Major which will be jointly accredited by CPA Australia and the Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand (CAANZ).

FASEA, governing body of Financial Advising/Financial Planning, has prescribed BX3113 Advanced Taxation Law as a desirable subject for students wanting to pursue a career in the financial advising industry. To be eligible for membership to the Tax Practitioners Board under Tax (Financial) Advisers, students need 1 commercial law subject, this is satisfied by BU1112 (completed in business core) and 1 Australian tax law subject, this is satisfied by BX3112 (financial advising major) and or BX3113 (elective subject).

ADDITIONAL COURSE RULES

A maximum of 30 credit points may be taken at level 1

A minimum of 18 credit points must be taken at level 2

A minimum of 18 credit points must be taken at level 3

COURSE PROGRESSION REQUISITES

Must successfully complete 12 credit points at level 1 before attempting any level 3 subject.

This course has a Work-Integrated Learning (WIL) program culminating in a third year core subject. Students must successfully complete the prescribed WIL preparation modules and quizzes to be eligible to apply for a WIL capstone subject.

PROFESSIONAL ACCREDITATION REQUIREMENTS

Pending accreditation with CPA and CAANZ for the Accounting Major within this program.

To be eligible for accreditation with Certified Practicing Accountants (CPA Australia) and/or the Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand (CAANZ) students must complete the Accounting major that consists of 30 credit points.
