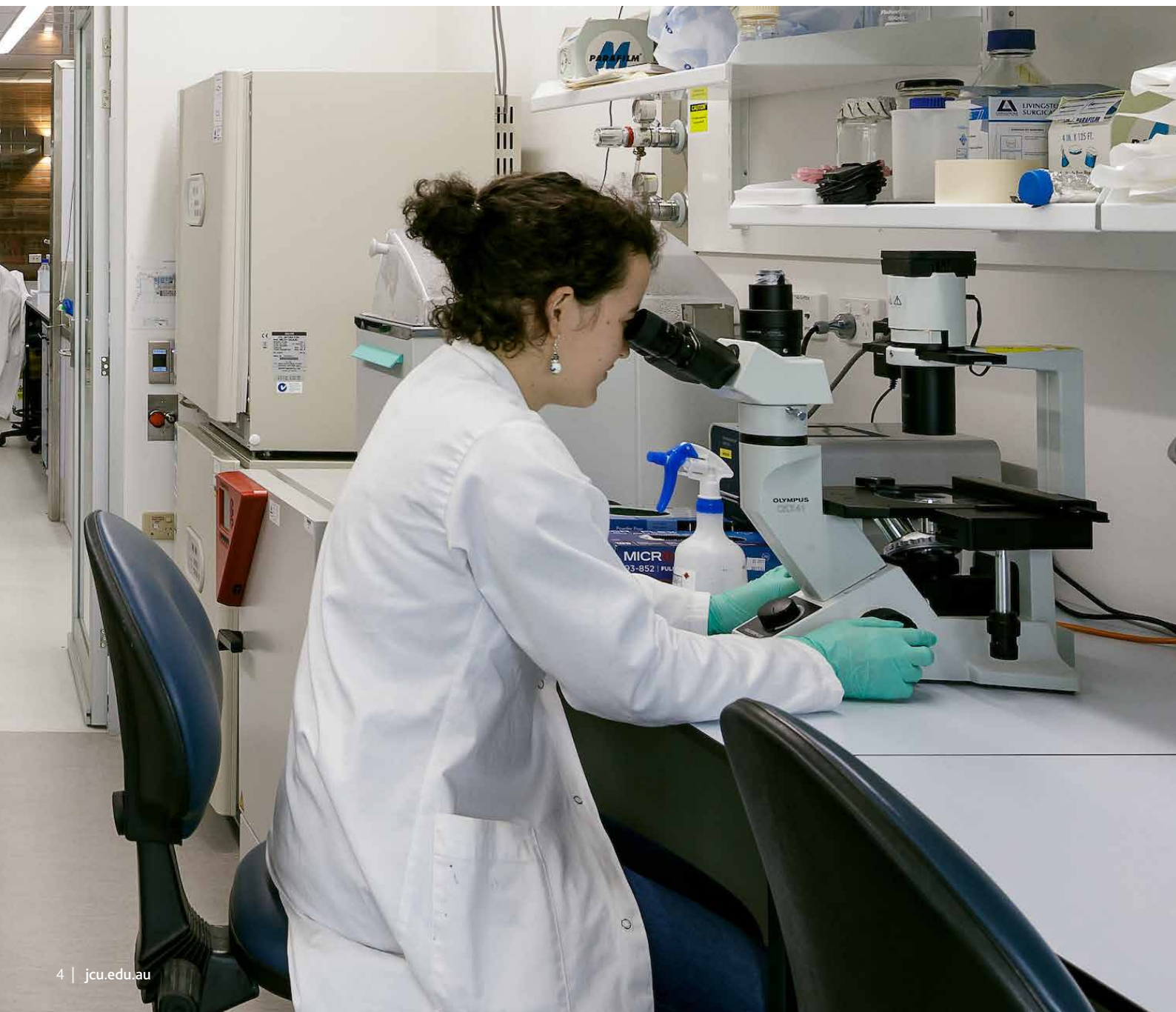

With a focus on human and animal health in the Tropics, the Graduate Diploma of Research Methods gives you the formal research training you need to enter a higher degree by research at JCU's [Graduate Research School](#).

Students will undertake an independent research project, guided by a planning subject before conducting their research data collection.

The Graduate Diploma of Research Methods comprises two core research-based subjects and a further four elective subjects from JCU's wide range of postgraduate research methods subjects. Options including Qualitative and other research methodologies for health professionals, Epidemiology for Public Health, Biostatistics and more are available to help tailor your knowledge to an area of interest.
