The story behind the logo, described by Nola is as follows:

"The centre represents the LEAP learning community of eight primary Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health care services and project partners and researchers. Outside are our communities... the various circles representing different aspects of community (e.g. different age groups) in which the services operate. The learning centre is connected to communities via lines representing two-way sharing of stories and knowledge."

Leap team travel to Naiuyu

Veronica and Karen travelled to Nauiyu community health service at the beginning of October to meet with Janet, Grace, Richelle and the rest of the Nauiyu team. The three day trip was very informative and health service staff were incredibly generous of their time during Veronica and Karen's visit. They talked about how quality improvement works at Nauiyu, what works well and potential areas to focus on for next year. Informal conversations under the trees with service users, provided good insights to community perspectives on what they would like to see at the community health service. Veronica and Karen also had the opportunity to explore the area -thanks to Richelle and Robbie for showing us around! Although they saw lots of croc footprints on the banks of the Daly River only spotted one croc and what we thought was a very lost stingray... but more likely a freshwater whipray!
