Graduate Opportunities

JCU offers a range of undergraduate and post graduate Education degrees.

Bachelor of Education (Early Childhood Education) – four-year undergraduate program which qualifies graduates to work with children aged from birth to eight, leading to work in schools, preschools, kindergartens and childcare centres.

The <u>Bachelor of Education (Primary)</u> – a four-year undergraduate program and the <u>Master of Teaching and Learning (Primary)</u> – a two year post graduate program, qualify graduates to work with students in Years 1 – 6.

The Bachelor of Education (Secondary)
– a four-year undergraduate program and
Master of Teaching and Learning
(Secondary) – two year post graduate
program, qualify graduates to work with
students in Years 7 – 12.

JCU's education degrees are recognized throughout Australia and internationally. Employers across Australian regularly contact JCU requesting to interview graduating education students.

Graduates work in government, independent and Catholic schools as well as overseas.

Registration

All JCU Education degrees are nationally accredited through the Australian Institute for Teaching and School Leadership (AITSL) in association with the Queensland College of Teachers (QCT).

Graduates of JCU Education degrees have demonstrated achievement of the graduate level of the Australian Professional Standards and are eligible for provisional teacher registration in Australia.

The Bachelor of Education (Early Childhood Education) is also fully accredited with the <u>Australian</u> Children's Education and Care Quality Authority (ACECQA).

Graduates are eligible for employment in the early childhood area (0-8 years) as an educator or service provider.

Provisional registration QLD

The <u>Queensland College of Teachers</u> (QCT) grants provisional registration to recent teacher education graduates.

Full teacher registration QLD

Full teacher registration is granted on: completion of one year of full time classroom practice or the part-time equivalent; successful demonstration of the **professional standards** for full registration and completion of a provisional to full recommendation report. (QCT December 2022)

Work Placements

The JCU Education programs place a strong emphasis on **professional practice experience and skill development.**

JCU coordinate Work placements that give you the opportunity to develop your skills with extensive hands on experience. You will need to be prepared and available for these blocks of practice teaching time.

LITERACY AND NUMERACY FOR INITIAL TEACHER EDUCATION (LANTITE)

Successful completion of the Literacy and Numeracy Test for Initial Teacher Education (LANTITE) is an expected requirement of the Australian Ministers for Education for all graduates. As a course completion requirement, all students enrolled in an initial teacher education course (either undergraduate or postgraduate) will be expected to sit and meet the test standard prior to graduation. As a course progression requisite, PST/GSTs enrolled in an ITE program at JCU from 2021 onwards must successfully complete LANTITE before commencing the final Professional Experience Placement. Professional Development
