

Highlights from the 3rd International BEMAS Conference Organised by the Centre for International Trade and Business in Asia (CITBA) @CBLG



The 3rd International Conference on Business, Economics, Management, and Sustainability (BEMAS)—one of the signature international events organized by the Centre for International Trade and Business in Asia (CITBA) at the College of Business, Law and Governance (CBLG), James Cook University—successfully concluded with extensive engagement and global participation. Associate Professor Taha Chaiechi, the General Chair for BEMAS and Centre Head of CITBA, led this year's conference with a visionary theme, "Reskilling Horizons: AI, The Future of Work, and the Quest for a Resilient, Sustainable Tomorrow", exploring how AI, ethics, and sustainability are shaping the future of work.

The conference spanned two and half days and featured **43 presentations** from participants (online and in person) representing **Australia**, **Spain**, **Malaysia**, **Singapore**, **Indonesia**, **India**, **and Vietnam**, underscoring BEMAS's global reach. The final day included a highly interactive **PhD Workshop**, led by the college ADRE, **Associate Professor Josephine Pryce** which provided a space for collaboration and guidance to emerging scholars.


































Looking Ahead
