Core Teaching Survey Questions

- 5. Overall, I was satisfied with the teaching of this staff member
- 6. What were the best aspects of this staff member's teaching? (open-ended)
- 7. Are there any area(s) of this staff member's teaching that could be improved? (open-ended)

Optional Teaching Survey Questions

If teaching staff are automatically or have opted-in for deployment of a YourJCU Teaching Survey, they will be invited to add up to two additional questions.

- This staff member promoted an understanding of indigenous Australian issues and cultures
- This staff member provided me with prompt assistance if required
- This staff member communicated clearly (e.g. was good at explaining concepts and assessment clearly)
- This staff member demonstrated a strong enthusiasm for the subject area
- This staff member demonstrated a strong knowledge of the subject area
- This staff member made the subject interesting (e.g. made the relevance of the subject clear)
- This staff member organized effective practical/laboratory sessions
- This staff member made group work a valuable experience
- This staff member demonstrated the skills to deliver subjects effectively in block/intensive mode
