Completions funding

A common question in the sector is around how completions funding is calculated. In particular what the implications are where a candidate is over time. Please go to the [government website](#) to see the exact modelling. As an advisor two key points are worth keeping in mind. One is that JCU will receive completions funding based on a count of the total number of HDR completions reported to the government each year. That count includes cotutelle graduates and over time graduates. Second the monies received account for completion, not time taken to completion. The university and advisory panel has a duty of care to support candidature, mindful of the common goal of timely completion, recognizing candidates capacity and changing circumstances and knowing there will be swings and roundabouts with candidates taking more or less than the time available.
