
JCU offers a range of presentations, workshops, hands-on activities, and services to support students, teachers, and parents and carers through the process of understanding future career options.

In the past year we have seen exceptional engagement numbers, which show how we can partner to ensure our students are ready today for tomorrow, reassured that gaining a world class education while maintaining a regional lifestyle is possible:

- Nearly 1,700 Year 10, 11 and 12 students from 51 different schools attended Open Day on campus at JCU.
- 1,280 Year 8 students from 35 different schools attended UniX on campus at JCU (UniX for Year 8 is held each year in November).
- More than 400 students attended a JCU Heroes program across Cairns, Townsville, Brisbane, Mackay and Rockhampton to get behind the scenes access into what their dream career may look like in the fields of Health, Business, Sport and Science.
- 1,362 school activities provided JCU with opportunities to engage students on their school campus. Activities were as diverse as Sky High Dreaming (to encourage aspiration and participation in higher education) and MBTI (Myer Briggs Type Indicator) activity (which explores emotional intelligence and strategies to build resilience).
- 110 JCU Student Ambassadors engaged directly with school students. Student Ambassadors are current JCU students able to share their university journey, including subject choices while at school, how to develop their ATAR potential if pursuing a general stream, career opportunities, early offers and bonus adjustments, QTAC and the application process, and what it is like studying at JCU.

The JCU Future Students team offer a variety of school presentations and activities, delivered by our experienced team of staff, student ambassadors and academics, to give your students a deeper understanding about university life and studying at JCU. While students' educational journeys are varied over their schooling life, having the opportunity to explore options outside the realm of school can help students make informed decisions about future career pathways.

Year 10 'Discover your Future' Presentation



This Year 10 presentation is designed to complement a student's Senior Education and Training (SET) plan by looking at personal attributes and subject choices. We also introduce students to university study and factors to be taken into consideration when looking at tertiary study as an option. This presentation can be co-delivered with Outreach's Career Quiz and SET Planning activity.

Year 11 'Intro to Uni' Presentation



This Year 11 workshop introduces key university concepts to students, including why university, terminology, support services and pathways to help prepare for life after high school.





JCU NOW Presentation



JCU NOW offers high achieving Year 11 and 12 students an opportunity to prepare for life beyond school by studying first year university subjects alongside their high school subjects. This presentation is perfect for senior students wanting to learn more about this program.

Science and Engineering Challenge



The Science and Engineering Challenge is a nationwide STEM outreach program. Students expand their knowledge by experiencing aspects of science and engineering not typically offered in a school environment. Year 10 students from across the region compete for a place at the State Super Challenge by constructing bridges, wiring cities, building a bionic hand, constructing earthquake proof towers and designing a catapult. Students are supported to explore scientific principles for themselves as the program encourages students to consider a future career in science or engineering.

On the tour, students prepare themselves for higher education by exploring JCU's facilities, courses, support services and what life is really like as a uni student (optional accommodation tour available).




Student opportunities

Outreach programs

Activities in school

JCU's Outreach team offer dedicated programs for primary and secondary students designed to build student confidence, clarity, and capacity for study. Underpinned by the Australian Blueprint for Career Development, JCU Outreach Framework and supported by Commonwealth Government funding, our activities aim to inspire students to reach their full potential and increase tertiary education attainment within North and Far North Queensland regions.

Who am I



Explore aspirations and self-concepts, attitudes, behaviours and relationships that influence student's learner identities.

Helpers and Supporters



This workshop develops students' awareness of what contributes to positive and effective relations, builds connections and an understanding of relationships between work, society and economy.

Sky High Dreaming



This workshop promotes students' career insights and awareness, exploring decision making and develop an understanding that careers exist.

Spaghetti Tower



This workshop develops positive self-concepts, behaviours and attitudes that contribute to effective ways of working collaboratively.

Study Skills



These workshops are tailored design for each year level to explore a variety of strategies to build confidence, capability and knowledge.

Year 7 students will explore learning methods, note taking styles and a systems approach study that informs and develops strategies students can apply to their own context.

Year 9 students will examine the process of reading and writing, strategies and how these skills are implemented in a tertiary context.

Year 10 students hear from a trained library educator about 'fake news' and deliberate misinformation spread via traditional news media and online social media, developing the tools and skills to distinguish the relevance, accuracy and purpose of information in the 21st century.

Race to the Board



This session explores and widens a student's understanding of university versus school environments, introduces tertiary vocabulary and increases familiarity to challenge stereotypical thinking.

Salary Auction



This session explores and understands the relationship between work, society and the economy.

UniScramble



This activity builds a student's understanding of a variety of learning and work environments and applies career building knowledge to locate, understand and navigate career information effectively.

Famous Faces



Develop student's knowledge and understanding of career stereotypes and to question their appropriateness.



Strengths, Opportunities, Aspirations and Results (SOAR)



This activity is designed to motivate students to build and maintain positive self-concepts, identify their strengths, opportunities and aspirations and understanding how individual characteristics such as interests, skills, values, beliefs and attitudes contribute to achieving personal, social, educational and professional goals.

Coaching Young People for Success



Session one is designed to motivate students to build and maintain positive self-concepts, identify their personal attributes and how characteristics such as interests, skills, values, beliefs and attitudes are interrelated and how to utilise these qualities to inform our life motivators.

Session two explores learning as a continual process throughout your career journey, navigating the world of work, building career knowledge and the interrelationships between life and work roles.

MBTI Emotional Intelligence



This activity explores emotional intelligence and strategies to build resilience. MBTI (Myer-Briggs Type Indicator) is a pseudoscientific self-report questionnaire where students acquire knowledge and skills to build positive self-concepts, apply abilities for building positive and effective relationships with others and develop strategies for responding to circumstances that may impact wellbeing, mental or physical health.

You and Your Career



This activity promotes student's self-awareness, making career decisions and successful work and life choices. This session helps to identify unique personal attributes, values, and skills, and put students on the path to discover a rewarding and meaningful career in an industry where they will thrive.

Career Quiz + SET Planning



This activity links skills, attributes, knowledge and aspirations to career areas and explores the world of work. Students gain knowledge of various pathways post school, an understanding of how people build their careers and the skills to locate and navigate career information effectively. This activity can be co-delivered with the Year 10 Discover Your Future presentation.

Money, Money, Money



This activity explores the relationship between work, society and the economy. Students gain an understanding of various costs associated with University and further education and to explore funding opportunities.





Outreach programs

Activities for your students on campus

On campus experience days

UniX Year 8



University Experience (UniX) brings together students from across North Queensland to provide a first-hand experience of university life and provide students with a day of immersive experiences and study tasters.

Indigenous Education and Research Centre (IERC)

The JCU Indigenous Education and Research Centre (IERC) supports indigenous students from when they begin considering study, through their time at JCU, to graduation and beyond. As well as support and services for current students, IERC offers two residential programs to prepare Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander high school students for university.

Aboriginals and Torres Strait Islanders in Marine Science (ATSIMS)



The ATSIMS program connects Year 10 students to marine science and management learning opportunities and workshops led by a range of industry experts over six weeks. The program is supported by Traditional Owners and representatives, and Indigenous Land and Sea Ranger groups within the North Queensland region. It empowers students to pursue further studies and consider future career pathways in marine science and management through a range of local and regional organisations.


Winter School



JCU Winter School offers students in Years 10, 11 and 12 the chance to experience university life during the school holidays. Over five days, students live on-campus and take part in academic lectures and team-building activities in an interactive program. Summer School



This summer pre-program focuses on building capacities in maths, English, digital literacy and tertiary study. JCU Summer School is for Year 12 graduates due to commence at JCU. Participants attend lectures and take part in team-building activities designed to prepare them for the demands of university study while also providing opportunities to connect with staff and form friendships with other students. All travel and accommodation costs are covered.

Immersive experiences

Study area immersive experiences

ICU offers a range of study area immersive experiences at our campus locations and research facilities throughout the year. These activities are tailored to complement students' high school subjects and provide practical experiences outside of the classroom.

Sports Performance



During the Sports Performance program students tour the JCU Sports and Exercise Science facilities and participate in physical activities including: jumping ability tests, sprinting, GPS tracking of sporting movements, jumping agility tests, motor learning, dynamic flexibility, balance, handgrip strength and height, weight and blood pressure monitoring. Students review their productivity and explore how data is used to increase athletic performance and manage rehabilitation after an injury.

Titration Competition



The Titration Competition is designed to encourage secondary students who enjoy Chemistry, particularly its practical side, to develop their scientific skills and understanding. It provides students an opportunity to experience conducting an experiment in a laboratory environment and the chance to compete at a national level.

Biomedicine Immersion Day



The Biomedical Science Immersion Workshop provides an interactive experience available for Years 10, 11 and 12 students who are considering studying biomedical science. Students will have the opportunity to participate in hands on activities in a PC2 laboratory relating to the five majors the Bachelor of Biomedical Science has to offer at JCU, including health, medical laboratory science, microbiology and immunology, molecular and cell biology, and physiology and pharmacology.

JCU Legal Studies Conference



The JCU Legal Studies Conference is a one-day program for teachers and students in Years 11 and 12 who are either studying Legal Studies or have a keen interest in the law. This year's theme will focus on Human Rights and will cover a range of legal topics that are highly relevant to the QCAA Legal Studies Syllabus. Topics are delivered through expert speakers and interactive sessions.

Young Language Ambassador Conference



The Young Language Ambassadors Conference promotes the importance of language education, international-mindedness and youth leadership. It brings together a selected number of outstanding language students across the North and Far North Queensland region.



Classroom on the Reef



Classroom on the Reef provides science students with engaging and innovative collection methods, state of the art research equipment and modern scientific techniques. They will experience a world class research facility in the Great Barrier Reef World Heritage Area, curriculum content designed for secondary school students, and live streaming underwater cameras, sensor data feeds and videos of the underwater environment.

Early Offers

With ICU Early Offers students enjoy the reassurance of knowing they have secured a place at JCU prior to ATAR results being released. With the support of their school, students work on a recommendation based on their academic performance, motivation, talents, passion and capabilities to demonstrate their likelihood of success at

Because we know each community is unique, we encourage schools to adopt a process which fits with their academic and career programs.

Offers are conditional on completion of the Oueensland Certificate of Education (or equivalent). Other conditions may also apply.

Getting an offer early supports students to finish Year 12 with confidence. It's one less thing they have to worry about.

Guaranteed Admission

Students who receive an ATAR of 90 are guaranteed entry into most ICU courses, with all subject prerequisites waived. Most ICU courses are eligible, which covers study areas like Arts, Business, Law, Engineering, Science, Information Technology, Pharmacy, and Sport and Exercise Science.

Applicants awarded an ATAR of 73 or above will be guaranteed entry into the same ICU courses but will need to meet the course subject prerequisites.

Adjustment Factors

Regional Preference Scheme: An automatic adjustment of an applicant's ATAR by two ranks. Available for students who reside in regional and remote Queensland (postcodes 4306 through to 4895).

Subject Adjustment Scheme: An automatic adjustment for students who have successfully completed high school subjects that require a high level of skill and knowledge. Adjustments are cumulative up to a maximum of ten (10) ranks and some exceptions apply.

Special consideration: JCU participates in QTAC's Educational Access Scheme (EAS) which recognises applicants who have been educationally disadvantaged due to: financial hardship, home environment and responsibilities, English language difficulty, personal illness and disability or educational disruption.

Pathways to JCU

JCU Prep

Prepare to embrace university study with ICU Prep. This Pathways program provides a flexible vehicle for students to develop the knowledge and skills required for their chosen undergraduate course. Available to school leavers who are, or will soon turn 18 years old, as well as mature students, they'll receive dedicated support in the areas they have identified. JCU Prep is the ideal stepping stone for those wanting to take on university study with confidence.

If students have not previously completed high school or are returning to study after a lengthy gap, they can start their JCU Prep journey with Introduction to Academic Learning. They'll learn the fundamentals of time management, note-taking, research, essay structure and referencing conventions. Developing the knowledge and skills to present academic arguments in multiple formats and begin to collaborate with their peers for long-term career success.

JCU Prep can also empower students to meet subject specific prerequisites. Preparatory subject offerings in Science, Chemistry and multiple streams of Mathematics will prepare them to meet the knowledge requirements of their target degree. Depending on the number of subjects they include in their study plan, it may take as little as three months for students to build the necessary knowledge and skills for university study.

As an enabling course, ICU Prep is subject fee-free, meaning students will only be required to pay a Student Services and Amenities Fee. No matter which area they're aiming to study within, they benefit from a supportive learning environment and personalised feedback designed to embrace their strengths and empower them to meet personal goals and achieve university success.

TAFE and VET qualifications

If your students have successfully completed a Certificate III, Certificate IV or an AQF Diploma course, they may be eligible for guaranteed entry into several JCU courses.*

Depending on their chosen course, there could be additional subject prerequisites they are required to meet to gain entry. These prerequisites generally require students to demonstrate English, Mathematics or Science knowledge at a particular level. If students do not meet the subject prerequisites for their desired course, consider JCU Prep as a pathway into their preferred degree.

Course Entry Diplomas

Explore the dynamic fields of Business, Engineering, Health, Information Technology (IT), and Tourism, Hospitality and Events. Equip your students for future career success and begin to build the core knowledge and skills specific to their chosen industry.

Course-entry diplomas combine introductory academic skills and first-year discipline-specific subjects to provide students with a small taste of their field of interest. Within these one-year full-time (two-years part-time) courses^, students will build a strong knowledge base and begin to develop core skills. Successful completion will lead to a diploma qualification, and students may use the theoretical understandings and practical skills developed to transition into specific JCU undergraduate courses.


